| Placement | Haematology |
| The type of work to expect and learning opportunities | A full time ward based post where the holder has direct responsibility for the management and ongoing care of all haematology patients on ward 33 and the Teenage and Young Adult unit regardless of diagnosis. The majority of haematology patients receiving high intensity chemotherapy including autologous transplantation or with neutropenic sepsis are managed on ward 33.In addition there will be middle grade cover a CMT doctor. There is always at least one member of medical staff on the ward during the working day. The post holder is responsible for ensuring that all patients on ward 33 have a venous thromboembolism (VTE) risk assessment completed on admission and that their immediate discharge letter (IDL) is completed prior to discharge. There will be great opportunity to learn about haematological malignancies and its management as well as management of bone marrow failure including neutropaenic sepsis. |
