

## **Foundation Training Job Description**

Placement	Cardiology
Department	The Department of Cardiology is a tertiary referral centre covering an extended population of 1.3 million people, and a local population of approximately 650,000. It provides the full diagnostic and treatment for all acute and chronic Cardiological conditions. The department and the surgical services have been integrated into a purpose built, state of the art £45 million DOH funded Centre for Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Surgery which opened in 2009. This has 3 dedicated Cardiothoracic Theatres with new outpatients, wards 26 and 27 and 28 in addition to CMU. There are 4 dedicated catheter labs covering EP, complex devices, elective and acute PCI work with access to a 12 beds ITU. There is a full range of coronary intervention and a range of non-invasive investigations including Trans-Oesophageal Echocardiogram, stress echo, myocardial contrast echo and tissue Doppler imaging. There is also nuclear scanning, 64 slice CT and cardiac MRI imaging facilities at HRI and CHH.
