

# Foundation Training Job Description

Grade	F2
Placement	Department of Medicine for the Elderly
Department	<p>The Department of Medicine for the Elderly (DME) has 5 wards in 2 hospitals, Hull Royal Infirmary (HRI) and Castle Hill Hospital (CHH). All wards are equal, managing acute medical issues and rehabilitating patients. There are 10 consultants.</p> <p>All medical admissions to Hull Royal Infirmary are channelled through the Acute Assessment Unit. The department is responsible for all patients aged 80 (or 75 years if patient has indicators of frailty) and over in the Acute Assessment Unit. Once the patient leaves the AAU, a ward-based system is in operation. The geriatricians are responsible for all medical patients on ward 8, 80 and 70 in HRI and ward 19 and 21 CHH. You are also expected to look after patients under geriatricians in the outlying areas (currently ward 9, 90 in HRI). A phlebotomy service operates every morning on all the Wards.</p> <p>The DME wards also receive transfers from other departments, notably Orthopaedics and General Surgery. There will be occasional DME patients on GHDU or ITU (3rd floor tower block).</p> <p>A typical team in the DME includes F1, F2 and/or CT, SpR and is led by a consultant/s and you will be fully supported. You are encouraged to attend outpatient clinics and will be fully supervised by a DME consultant. Your on call duty rota is provided by the Human resources Department and one of our secretaries from the DME coordinates all your leaves, weekly time table and on call duties.</p>

<p>Educational and Clinical Supervisor(s) for the placement</p>	<p>Will be allocated when you join the training programme.</p>
<p>Main duties of the placement</p>	<p>Consultants are present 0800 - 2200 hrs during weekdays and 0800 - 1700 during weekend days. Middle Grades and SpRs are present 24/7 for teaching/support/advice. This means that you will never be expected to make difficult decisions `on your own`. There are plenty of opportunities for `shopfloor teaching` and you will be expected to participate in the initial management of critical illness under supervision.</p> <p>The rota you will be expected to work is a full shift rota. The average contracted hours must not be exceeded. However, in exceptional circumstances, practitioners in the grades of Senior Registrar, Specialist Registrar, Core Trainees and F2 shall be expected in the normal run of their duties, and within their contract and job description to cover for the occasional brief absence of colleagues as far as is practicable. Sick colleagues will normally be covered only for short periods of absence.</p>
