| Department | The Emergency Department at the Scunthorpe General Hospital provides a 24-hour emergency service to a population in excess of 200,000. The department uses the Symphony system for patient records and PACS is available for viewing digital x-rays. There is a "see and treat" area for the assessment of ambulatory patients. There is musculo skeletal clinic 5 days a week based in EM with middle grades contributing to the running of the clinic. The department comprises the following facilities: 10 cubicles for trolley patients 3 bedded resuscitation room |
