The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Specialist palliative care and ward management of patients on the 16 bedded inpatient unit at Manorlands Hospice. 1 day a week on AAU (Wednesdays)
Where the placement is based	Manorlands Hospice
Main duties of the placement	<p>Responsibilities include day to day care of all patients on the ward (admission clerking and assessment, daily or more frequent clinical review, legible notes in medical records, prescribing, requesting investigations and actioning results,) Other routine ward duties include, blood taking, insertion of i/v cannula, catheterisation as required. Attending consultant ward round and clinical review meetings (MDT) as required. Participate in audit.</p> <p>Discharge planning and discharge notifications, writing of TTO's Maintaining patient safety by abiding by the Medicines Code, Infection Prevention procedures and Medical Equipment/Devices policy. Discussions around advance care planning and DNACPR Death certification and completion of cremation forms as required.</p>
Typical working pattern in this placement	The hours are 9-5 except on Tuesday when the start time is 8.30 for the Doctors educational meeting. Wednesdays 8- 5 on AAU There is no on-call.
