| The type of work to expect<br>and learning opportunities | The generic skills Programme comprises 6 days (including 2 in shadowing)<br>and is delivered in conjunction with trainees from Airedale, Calderdale &<br>Huddersfield. There is mandatory protected Foundation Year 1 teaching each<br>Wednesday lunch time which covers a broad range of medical/surgical topics.   |
|  | There is a general medical meeting each Tuesday lunchtime for all grades.<br>Within each specialty there are a number of educational opportunities including<br>clinical governance, MDT meetings and radiology meetings. All Foundation<br>Year 1 undergo a day of simulation training through the year based on generic<br>skills, recognition and management of the acutely unwell patient. |
|  | You are encouraged to apply for a maximum of 3 taster days in different specialties. There is no additional allocated study leave for Foundation Year 1.   |

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| Main duties of the placement                 | Patient safety is a priority for all trainees. The posts include typical ward based<br>activities such as general clerking duties, daily ward round with seniors,<br>organisation of tests, communications with relatives and members of the MDT.<br>In addition, for the banded posts there are rostered commitments to the<br>Medical Admissions Unit where you will gain experience in acute medical<br>problems under supervision. As a Foundation trainee, you will be a key<br>member of the team, supported by your middle grade and consultant<br>colleagues. You will have an important role in providing continuity of care to<br>your patients. |
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| Typical working pattern in<br>this placement | All posts offer a ward based attachment.<br>The regular hours of work are 08:00 – 17:00.<br>For the banded posts, the normal hours of work are 09:00 – 17:00. In addition,<br>there is a rostered attachment to MAU as follows:<br>Within each 16 week period:<br>• 1 week Monday – Sunday 08:00 – 16:00<br>• 1 week Monday – Sunday 15:30 – 22:00<br>In addition:<br>• 1 weekend (Saturday & Sunday) 08:00 – 20:30 covering the medical wards   |
