Department	<p>All emergency general surgery is admitted to Huddersfield and all the units participate in receiving and managing these patients.</p> <p>In addition, there is an upper GI unit performing a range of biliary, upper GI and laparoscopic procedures. There is a colorectal unit dealing with malignancies and large bowel surgery. There is a vascular unit dealing with a full range of vascular surgery, both emergency and elective cases. There is also a urology unit.</p> <p>Breast surgery and many elective general surgical cases are admitted to and operated on at Calderdale Royal Hospital.</p> <p>14 x Consultants, 6 x SpR, 8 x ST1/2, 14 x FY1s, 3 x FY2s, 12 x Trust/Specialty</p>
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	In addition to the Generic Skills Programme there is mandatory F1 teaching session each Wednesday. There is also Surgical Teaching for Junior Doctors every Thursday as well as Clinical Radiology teaching every Tuesday. There is also a monthly rolling audit programme.

<p>Main duties of the placement</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • F1s are responsible for the clerking of all patients on admission and the initial arrangements for the routine management of these patients. At all times either a F2/ST 1-3 or a Registrar is present in the hospital. • F1 duties are mainly centered on the wards with occasional attendance in the operating theatres. F1s are not expected to attend routine out-patients clinics. F1s, however, are expected to attend patients in the Accident and Emergency Department upon request from that Department. • If adequately and appropriately trained F1s will be responsible for ensuring that all consent forms before operation are properly completed and that the site of operation is indicated on each patient. Patients and relatives must be kept fully informed of the treatment to be given. • F1s are responsible for ensuring that patients are discharged with the appropriate drugs and seeing that the patients understand the use of these. • F1s are required to complete a brief discharge note for the patients' general practitioner at the time of the patients' discharge from hospital. • F1s are required to cover for colleagues' annual leave and short-term sickness. • Any other duties which may be allocated from time to time commensurate with the grade
<p>Typical working pattern in this placement</p>	<p>F1's work a 1:14 rota. This will include long days on call from 8.00am – 6.00pm and twilight on call shifts from 4.00pm until 2.00am (followed by rest day). One week in 14 will be spent at Calderdale Royal Hospital.</p>
