## **Foundation Training Job Description**

Grade	F1
Placement	Haematology and Oncology
Department	The department offers excellent training opportunities in acute general oncology and haematology. On average there are 2 elective chemotherapy and 2 emergency admissions each day, but the ward is very busy on a daily basis managing 22 patients with problems related to cancer. Registrars undertake ward rounds each day and there are full consultant ward rounds twice a week (with other members of the team, including palliative care, physiotherapy, OT and social workers). All the major cancer sites are covered. We are a busy unit assessing all admissions to the ward, which provides excellent opportunity to gain experience in oncology and haematology. There are specialist nurse teams for haematology, colorectal, upper GI and breast cancer.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	In addition to the Generic Skills Programme there is mandatory F1 teaching session each Wednesday. There is also weekly Departmental Teaching and teaching clinics and ward rounds. There is also a monthly rolling audit programme and weekly MDTs.
Where the placement is based	Huddersfield Royal Infirmary
Main duties of the placement	<ul> <li>Day to day management of patients under consultant care.</li> <li>Clerking of patients admitted to the unit.</li> <li>Regular attendance at ward rounds held by consultant and registrar.</li> <li>Completion of death certification, when necessary.</li> <li>The cover of colleagues on annual leave and short-term sickness.</li> <li>Any other duties commensurate with the grade which may be allocated from time to time.</li> </ul>
