Department	<p>The department offers a full range of General Paediatric and Neonatal Services with inpatient care being based at Calderdale Royal Hospital where the trainee will be based.</p> <p>The eConsultants operate a weekly acute eConsultant rota for generalGeneral paediatrics-Paediatrics and a corresponding rota for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.</p> <p>The team has an excellent ethos in terms of training and there are three hours of teaching a week, apart from a weekly radiology meeting and grand round. The team consists of 16 consultants, 3 Associate Specialists, 2 specialty doctors, 10 ST1-2s, 11 ST3s and above, 1 FY1 and 2 FY2s</p>
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>In addition to the Generic Skills Programme there is mandatory FY1 teaching session each Wednesday. There are fFormal paediatric teaching sessions are held on Monday, Tuesdays and WednesdayFridays. There is also-X-Ray teaching on a Wednesdays.</p> <p>A multi-disciplinary teaching programme is held every Thursday. There is also a monthly rolling audit programme.</p>

Main duties of the placement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day to day management of patients under consultant care. • Regular attendance at ward rounds held by consultant and registrar. • Assistance with the Radiology Department with X-Ray procedures as required through a rota arrangement.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The FY1 trainee is supernumerary and therefore does not participate on junior doctor shift rotas. The emphasis is upon acquiring core paediatric skills with comprehensive supervision from the middle grade and consultant staff.
