Placement	Acute and Metabolic Medicine 14/YHD/RCD00/01/F2/004
Department	Directorate information: The Department provides excellent training opportunities in general medicine as well as diabetes and endocrinology.
	The department looks after patients with acute diabetes related problems; major electrolyte imbalances including hypercalcemia and hyponatremia and a myriad of acute medical problems. Emergency medical cases are admitted each day via the admissions unit. During the day the acute take has constant consultant supervision via the CATT team. All major medical specialties have consultant cover; facilities include a stroke unit, CCU, HDU and ITU beds; CT, MRI, coronary angiography, permanent pacemaker fitting and endoscopy/bronchoscopy services are provided on site. Clinical support workers help on-call teams with venesection, ECG's ,phlebotomy etc. Critical care outreach service support is available through the week for acutely unwell patients and ITU step down patients. Specialist nurse teams include those for cardiology, diabetes, respiratory medicine and palliative care. In addition there are elective admissions in most specialties, and we have a day care unit that provides planned care and arranged for dynamic endocrine tests.
	Staffing in the Diabetes &Endocrine Directorate: The medical team consists of:

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- 4 Consultants
- 2 Specialist Trainees
- 1 CMT, 1 FY2 and 1 FY1
- 4 Diabetes Specialist Nurses,

Inpatient diabetes specialist nurses will support you on the wards.

Visiting consultants from York and Leeds provide cover for renal medicine, vascular surgery, out-patient dialysis and oncology amongst others.

The Department of Chemical Pathology

The department is led by a Consultant Clinical Scientist and has several Biomedical Scientists. A wide repertoire of tests is provided by the laboratory which is CPA accredited. Specialised tests are sent away to other CPA-Accredited laboratories. Consultant support is available for interpretation of test results and clinical advice. The laboratory has a special interest in testing outside the laboratory and in the methodology of decision support. The consultant clinical scientist is also an active member of the Diabetes and Endocrinology team and the department is involved in the clinical meetings of this unit. The department is housed in new and spacious laboratory accommodation in the Fewston Wing of Harrogate District Hospital.

The Department of Diabetes and Endocrinology

The department is led by 4 Consultant Physicians supported by diabetes nurse specialists. Each week there is a general diabetes clinic, endocrine clinic, insulin pump clinic, diabetic foot clinic, diabetic/endocrine pregnancy clinic and twice monthly young adult clinics. There are 2 MDTs a week, at which patients with metabolic problems and results of complex endocrine patients and results of dynamic endocrine investigations are discussed.

Intensive Care

The metabolic/endocrine team provide advice ITU on metabolic problems. There is the opportunity for the trainee to attend the morning ITU ward round when other commitments allow.

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The type of work to expect and learning opportunities

This post is an opportunity to become involved in both metabolic and acute medicine. Learn about pathophysiological process and the interpretation of clinical pathological data. You will also have direct clinical exposure to patients with metabolic and endocrinological conditions. It provides an opportunity to work with multi-disciplinary teams within chemical pathology, diabetes and endocrinology, and intensive care. The post holder will also be expected to complete a clinical audit project within the four month attachment. Educational Opportunities:

- Equivalent of 2 weeks attachment to the pathology laboratory to gain biochemistry experience.
- Experience in the assessment and treatment of the acutely ill patient
- To understand the importance of comprehensive acute medical assessment
- To understand the working of the multidisciplinary team caring for the elderly and each individual's role and input
- Directorate educational meeting every Wednesday lunch time.
- Departmental MDT twice a week,
- X-ray meeting every Thursday lunchtime
- Clinical governance sessions covering audit, guidelines, incident reporting etc
- Hospital continuing professional development meetings, Education Centre
- Regular meetings with educational supervisor

Supporting professional activities

- Participate in and contribute towards the training programme of colleagues, students and other health care professionals e.g. ad hoc training and supervision, tutorials and lectures.
- Have a teaching responsibility for supervision and training of F1 doctors and medical students.
- Keep up-to-date records to satisfy continuous professional development requirements.
- It is expected that the post holder will complete and write up an audit project
- Work within the clinical governance framework as agreed within the Trust.

Main duties of the placement	 Clinical care: Care of inpatients admitted under the diabetes team. You will have CMT/Middle grade support. Clerking and assessment of new and follow up out patients with diabetes/metabolic problems. You will be supernumerary in clinic and attendance will be to suit your training needs. Attend ITU ward rounds to learn about metabolic problems in critical care. (Optional- depending on training interest etc) Supervise / perform dynamic metabolic function tests. Assist with interpretation and reporting of biochemical tests under the supervision of the consultant chemical pathology and begin the principles of clinical leadership.
	FY2s are expected to be flexible in their working arrangements. Out of hours commitments and responsibilities: A 3 tier on-call system is in operation out of hours for new admissions and ward responsibilities. Tier 2 is on call 1:14 and covers admissions (during day) and ward duties (night time only). During normal hours Mon-Fri all requests for medical admissions, and initial triage and management are dealt with by an acute medicine on call team and CAT consultant.
