The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The post holder will be expected to build on their undergraduate educational training. To gain experience and familiarity in dealing with a wide variety of medical conditions. To develop the skills of history taking, physical examination, appropriate investigation and rational prescribing. To master several basic surgical and medical techniques. To improve communication skills with patients, relatives and colleagues. To develop skills in managing time and conflicting priorities At the end of the four month period the FY1 will have obtained experience in the following: Rehabilitation of patients with musculoskeletal disorders including arthritis and fractures, neurological disorders and cardiopulmonary disorders Obtain skills in assessing neurological disability; cognitive function; specific treatment of osteoporosis and rheumatoid arthritis Recognise the need for holistic approach including social factors and family support. Understand the role of physiotherapists and occupational therapists in rehabilitation both in hospital and community.
