Main duties of the placement	Post holders can expect to see a wide range of common conditions and attain considerable skill in their diagnosis, treatment and management.
	Contact to be maintained with the nurse in charge of the ward and instruction and advice on treatment to be issued.
	Responsibility for the day-to-day care of all medical admissions to the children's ward at Scarborough Hospital, the admission of all acute surgical paediatric cases and for the admission of a small number of children receiving dental surgery.  Responsible for the routine examination of normal new born babies in the maternity ward, resuscitation of the new born in the delivery suites and the care of patients in the Special Care Baby Unit.
	Timetabled attendance at general paediatric and specialist (epilepsy, diabetes, respiratory and child development) clinics Child assessment sessions and multi-disciplinary case discussions are held at Scarborough Hospital and the peripheral clinics
