Foundation Training Job Description

Grade	F2
Placement	General Psychiatry
Department	One post is based on Maple Ward at The Longley Centre, Northern General Hospital, supervised by Dr H Daudjee. This is a busy General Adult Acute Admission Ward. The F2 Training will gain experience in the assessment and management of a wide range of mental health problems. They will also have supervised experience in the Outpatient Clinic (1 clinic per week). The F2 Training will be supported in attending the Post Graduate Training Programme in Psychiatry, which includes weekly Case Conference and Journal Clubs. They will also attend the F2 Training Programme.
	The second post is based on Burbage Ward, Michael Carlisle Centre, Sheffield with Dr James Allen. There are 19 general adult inpatient beds on the unit, serving the south west sector of the city (an area of relative affluence with pockets of deprivation). There is one consultant psychiatrist for the ward. The team also includes a ward manager, various grades of nursing staff, support and care workers, a pharmacist, occupational therapists, a discharge coordinator and various administrative and support staff. There are two junior doctors.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The trainee will be encouraged to create a personal development plan appropriate to this placement. The trainee will be expected to attend: academic case conferences; academic dept Journal Club; FY2 teaching programme. Supervision - one hour weekly, arranged at a mutually convenient time, plus
Main duties of the placement	day to day supervision and teaching on the ward from consultant. This trainee will look after half (approx 10) of the general psychiatry inpatients; assess patients on and after admission and complete appropriate multidisciplinary documentation (joint admission summary and detailed risk assessment); review mental state and history regularly - at least once a week; complete a physical examination in detail and arrange necessary investigations and referrals; participate in ward work as part of the multidisciplinary team; attend weekly MDT meetings; take part in the on call rotas; cover the other FY trainee's leave; participate in clinical governance; complete an audit either selfgenerated after discussion with consultant or from within the Directorate's audit programme; attend regular supervision with

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	clinical and educational supervisors; show a willingness to be involved in teaching activities, especially with medical students.
