Department	The Neurosurgery Department is part of the Neurosciences Directorate at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital and is based on Ward N2 and K floor (NeuroCritical Care). The Neurosurgery Department provides elective and 24 hour emergency neurosurgery services for Sheffield and the surrounding districts with a tertiary referral population of 2.5 million. The Department has 3 dedicated neurosurgery theatres, a dedicated neuro-radiology department with CT and MRI scanning facilities and a digital angiography suite equipped to perform endovascular procedures. The Department of Neurosurgery also includes the National Stereotactic Radiosurgery Unit, serviced by the Leksell Gamma Knife. Research facilities within the Unit include a microvascular laboratory for study of cerebral blood flow, a neuro- oncology laboratory for study of malignant gliomas and meningiomas and extensive research facilities within the Stereotactic Radiosurgery Unit.
