## Self-assessment guidelines for Candidates - ST3 ACCS & DRE-EM

The 2026 National Emergency Medicine ST3 ACCS/ST3 DRE-EM Selection Portfolio Section will be assessed as an online process. All candidates meeting the eligibility criteria will be asked to complete the Self-Assessment as detailed in this document.

Candidates are initially requested to self-score their Portfolio submitting their scores on their application in the Oriel system. There will then be a 7 day window (dates and details can be found in the ST3 ACCS Emergency Medicine & ST3 DRE-EM Candidate Handbook) where candidates will be required to upload supporting evidence via the Health Education England Online Portal. Validation of each candidate's self-assessment scores will be performed by the Assessment Team. The candidate will be notified of any changes to their self-assessment score. Candidates will be advised of the appeals process if they wish to contest their final score. The specific dates for each stage of this process will be published on the National ST3 ACCS/ST3 DRE-EM website.

## Self-Assessment:

- This form contains the framework for applicants' self-assessment scoring.
- Applicants will be asked to complete the multiple-choice questions for each section on an online form to derive a final self-assessment score (questions may appear slightly differently on the final application form). Only one bullet point/response for each question can contribute to the score.
- Candidates will be asked to provide portfolio evidence to support the answers given during self-assessment and submit this via the online interface. Candidates are instructed to only provide evidence regarding the self-assessment questions and will only be able to upload one document per question. Candidates are responsible for ensuring that the document uploaded provides sufficient evidence.
- No additional evidence will be accepted following the self-assessment submission date.
- <u>Candidates are responsible for ensuring that they upload the correct evidence onto the correct system.</u>

  <u>Evidence uploaded onto the wrong system will not be considered and therefore will not be awarded marks.</u>
- All submitted self-assessments will be validated by a team of assessors who cross-check the candidates own scores with submitted evidence and agree a final score.
- Candidates will be notified of their final score.
- If a candidate wishes to appeal their final assessment score, they will have 72 hours to do so via the appeals process. Appeals can only be based on the evidence the candidate originally submitted. Further submissions of evidence will not be accepted or considered.
- Appeals will be presided by the Portfolio Adjudication Panel. The outcome of an appeal will be returned to the applicant within a short timeframe. The Adjudication Panel will have the final decision on the self-assessment score at the end of this process.
- Please do NOT submit the Alternative Certificate of Competences as evidence against any of the selfassessment questions on the next page.

## Please note:

- If a candidate's evidence is not provided on the specified system and evidence cannot be verified by the assessor during the allocated time, a score of zero will be awarded for that element of the portfolio.
- Candidates considered to have <u>not</u> provided documents to substantiate their score, or provided documents that are inaccurate, falsified, or contain private or confidential patient details will have evidence taken and be referred to a Scrutiny Panel. The Scrutiny Panel will be conducted by Health Education England and the candidate will be offered an opportunity to explain their actions and provide supporting documentation. The result of the Scrutiny Panel may lead to one or more of, but not limited to, the following:
- o Candidate removed from the current round of National Emergency Medicine recruitment.
- o Candidate being reported to the GMC.
