Department	<p>The Paediatric department at Barnsley Hospital provides inpatient paediatric care on the Children’s ward and there are 14 Neonatal cots, which include intensive care, HDU and special care cots.</p> <p>There are almost daily outpatient general paediatric clinics including a number of specialist outreach clinics in addition to the Community Paediatric team run clinics at New Street Health Centre and peripheral outreach clinics.</p> <p>On call rota provision provided by: Second on Call Paediatric Specialist Trainees (ST4+) Speciality Doctors on both tiers First on call GP VTS and Paediatric Specialist Trainees 1 Foundation 2 post (FY2) 3 Foundation 1 posts (FY1)</p>
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust provides all acute paediatric services including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consultant of the week rota system • 8-12 bed Children’s Ward (Medical and Surgical) including 2 High-Dependency Cubicles • 9 bed Children’s Assessment Unit • 14 cot Neonatal Unit • Children's Outpatient Department • Joint clinics with specialists from tertiary centres including cardiology, endocrinology and nephrology • Children’s Community Nursing Services (Generic and Specialist Neonatal, Diabetes and Asthma services). • Play Team • Ready access to the full range of tertiary specialties and specialist Paediatric imaging and laboratory services • Postnatal ward work and delivery suite opportunities
	<p>The rota allows training time spent in all paediatric areas. This will include time spent in Community Child Health Services which is located at New Street Health Centre in the town Centre a mile away from the hospital.</p>

Educational and Clinical Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr E Gouta, Dr A Nussbaumer
Main duties of the placement	<p>The post will be spent working in the hospital and in the community. The work involves supervised ward work for medical inpatients, neonatal patients, postnatal problems and some deliveries. This includes clerking admissions to CAU referred from General Practitioners, ED and from other Departments in the hospital.</p> <p>Specific duties may vary with the circumstances from time to time and the developing competence and interest of members of the firm. Range of roles includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • attending and contributing to handover, ward rounds, outpatient clinics, Children’s Assessment unit, assisting the tier 1 doctor at deliveries and postnatal ward work, SCBU and visits to individual patients as may be necessary. • to arrange such investigations (x-ray, pathology, etc) as may be necessary • to attend and participate in educational meetings • to keep such records as may be required for medical and/or administrative reasons • to encourage and teach medical students • to participate in Quality Improvement projects • to communicate with patients, their relatives, family doctors and other health and social services colleagues. This includes immediate liaison with the consultants and other more senior staff. • there will also be opportunities to gain skills in paediatric blood taking and cannulation
Typical working pattern in this placement	<p>This post complies with the “New Deal” and includes evening and weekend work however this is supernumerary and additional to the tier 1 on call rota.</p> <p>Handovers between shifts are for 45 mins in the morning and 30 mins in the evening at night.</p>
