<b>Type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>This is an Orthogeriatric post, providing medical care, predominantly for frail older patients with fragility fractures. You will work with Orthogeriatricians and Orthopaedic Surgeons within the Orthopaedics Department at the Leeds General Infirmary.</p> <p><b>Clinical Duties include:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participating in and completing clinical tasks generated from ward rounds, including preparing patients for theatre and managing patients postoperatively</li> <li>• Ward work for patients in whom a fracture is just one component of medical/psychosocial frailty</li> <li>• Assessing patients and formulating management plans</li> <li>• Liaising with members of the multi-disciplinary team about care and discharge planning</li> <li>• Communicating with patients and their families</li> <li>• Supervision is provided by Consultants</li> </ul> <p><b>Supporting Professional Activities:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly programme of departmental teaching</li> <li>• Monthly Audit and Mortality Meetings</li> <li>• Opportunity to take part in Quality Improvement Projects</li> <li>• Library facilities are available to all trainees</li> </ul>
