Department	The Home Treatment Team provides multidisciplinary crisis care to service users with acute presentations of mental illness.
	We work to support service users in the community as an alternative to hospital admission and provide step down care for those who have recently been discharged from inpatient hospital settings.
	We work collaboratively at the interface between the inpatient wards and the various community teams delivering mental health care to enable a clinically sound and safe alternative to inpatient care for the acutely ill patient. Our team aims to facilitate optimisation of available inpatient capacity and to limit the length of inpatient stays to the bare clinical minimum.
	Foundation doctors will work within one of two Home Treatment teams covering either the North or South of the City. They will work closely with a multi- professional team which includes community psychiatric nurses, clinical psychologists, pharmacists and Support workers.

To attend the internal educational activities including local and regional Grand Rounds, CPD sessions as well as the Quality Improvement Group.
