Placement	General (Gastrointestinal) Surgery (Upper GI and Lower GI)
Department	Upper GI Surgery and Colorectal Surgery
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>4 months of general/GI surgery with 6 weeks of acute surgical experience at HRI and 2 1/2 months in elective upper GI or colorectal surgery.</p> <p>Exposure will include:</p> <p>Acute presentations of surgical pathology (obstruction, perforation, intra-abdominal sepsis)</p> <p>Postoperative complications and deteriorating patients, assessment and resuscitation.</p> <p>Clerking and history taking, initiating treatment and investigations, presenting on ward rounds, liaising with allied specialities and services.</p> <p>Exposure to elective benign and cancer surgery including pancreatic, bariatric, oesophago-gastric and hernia repair and gallstone disease surgery.</p> <p>Continuing Professional and Portfolio development through FY1 Thursday teaching attendance, monthly contribution to departmental Governance and M&M Meeting and departmental teaching</p> <p>Opportunities to attend theatre and scrub in to operations and assist where ward cover staffing levels allow.</p> <p>Full induction pack for acute surgery will be provided prior to starting detailing rota and leave, clinical experience exposure and roles and responsibilities.</p>
Where the placement is based	<p>Castle Hill Hospital for Elective Upper GI (Ward 14) and Colorectal Surgery (ward 10/11)</p> <p>Hull Royal Infirmary (Ward 6/60) for Acute Surgery</p>
Educational and Clinical Supervisor(s) for the placement	Will be allocated when you join the training programme.

Main duties of the placement	Day to day management of elective upper GI surgery and colorectal surgery admissions and acute surgery admissions through 6 week rota blocks in the acute general surgery on ward 6/60 at Hull Royal Infirmary.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Cross cover rota between Elective Surgery at Castle Hill Hospital and Acute Surgery at Hull Royal Infirmary. Days, Long days, Weekends and Night shifts will be worked on Acute Surgery and Day Shifts, Weekends and Long days will be worked on Elective Surgery. Rota pattern will be confirmed via work schedule issued 8 weeks before start date and e-Roster will be published with personalised rota pattern 6 weeks prior to start date.
