# **DME DFT Candidate Instructions**

Thank you for enrolling for your Dental Medical Emergencies (DME) training.

There are three elements to DME training, providing 9 hours of verifiable CPD:

- Dental Acute Illness Management (DentAIM) HEE DFTs online programme via Athena (4 hours approx)
- You must create a new account to allow the DME team to enrol you on the course. You will be provided with an opportunity to do this during the induction day on the 1st of September. Please make sure you have access to a suitable device and these candidate instructions.

The DentAIM online programme provides core DME theory modules, which can be completed at your own pace but must be completed before you attend the ABCDE interactive lecture. Each module will unlock as you successfully progress through the programme. You will be able to view your success and progress in the Gradebook.


Candidates that fail to complete the DentAIM online programme will not be able to progress with the rest of the DME programme and will not receive CPD.

Please use a browser other than Internet Explorer, as this does not appear to be compatible with the content. If you experience any issues accessing Athena or with the DentAIM modules, please follow the following troubleshooting steps.

### **Troubleshooting Steps**

- Swap browser to either chrome or edge to access Athena.
- Run browser updates
- Try opening the course in an incognito browser. Click the three dots in the chrome menu and select New Incognito window.
- Check your browser security settings are set to allow pop-ups.
- Clear all cookies and cache from your browser history.
- Revisit the last module that you successfully completed ensuring you exit the module via the Red exit button on the "Summary" page.

## 3. ABCDE Interactive Lecture (1 hour)

The facilitators will use Mentimeter to provide an interactive learning experience. You may find it helpful to have access to a second device, such as a mobile phone.

The sessions are held in the <a href="Worsley-Building">Worsley</a> Building, Medical Emergencies' Simulation Suite on Level 6, next to the computer cluster. Please arrive promptly to the session.
