

Transition to Leadership 2020 Online Course - National Advert

Transition to Leadership is a free course to help prepare paediatric SHOs who are transitioning to a Registrar position in 2020.

This well-established course ran annually for several years face-to-face, and due to Covid-19, has been adapted to run ONLINE for this year.

The course is organised by the London School of Paediatrics - if your own deanery is not currently running a similar course, this year we are offering the opportunity to all transitioning SHOs across the UK, to join our virtual course.

The course consists of 3 elements:

- Transition to Leadership Handbook
- Webinar Series
- Remote small-group interactive workshops on Putting Leadership into Practice via Zoom
